

General Information for Foreign Applicants

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1. Admission Requirements

Admission requirements for Bachelor degree programs

Austria has signed bilateral and multilateral agreements with many countries concerning the mutual recognition of secondary school diplomas. Such agreements ensure that foreign secondary school diplomas are recognized in Austria. This makes foreign secondary school graduates eligible to study at all universities and universities of applied sciences in Austria.

Supplementary exams

Prospective students from countries that do not have such an agreement with Austria and who have a secondary school diploma that is not similar to the Austrian secondary school diploma (in Austria called 'Matura') are required to take supplementary exams to fulfill the admission requirements for a Bachelor's degree program.

Admission requirements for Master degree programs

You must meet subject-matter requirements to be admitted to a Master's degree program. Prerequisites include a Bachelor's degree from a UAS in a relevant subject matter or an equivalent degree from a recognized post-secondary educational institution (at least 180 ECTS credits) in Austria or another country. If basic equivalence has been established except for a few missing prerequisites, the program director can require students to take exams to establish full equivalence. These exams are taken during the Master's program. The criteria for basic equivalence vary from degree program to degree program. They are published on the degree program pages.

Legalization and translation of documents

Foreign secondary and/or tertiary qualifications give the same validity as domestic documents only if they are either exempt from legalization or have passed the necessary legalization procedure.

If your documents were issued abroad, you will need to have these certified in line with the relevant guidelines so that they can be recognized in Austria – and thus by UAS Technikum Wien. If your documents have not been issued in German or in English, you must also submit a German or English translation which must meet certain criteria as well. You can select the country in which your documents were issued on the [following page](#), and will then be forwarded to the associated legalization regulations and translation rules.

Sufficient language skills

To attend a German-language degree program, language skills at level B2 or higher in both German and English (see "[Common European Framework of Reference for Languages](#)"), starting from the winter term 2026/27 are required. The required language skills must correspond to level B2 of the "[Common European Framework of Reference for Languages](#)" in all four skill areas (listening, reading, speaking, writing) and must be

presented by means of a [certificate](#) or school leaving certificate at the time of application, but not later than May 31.

Exception: For English-language degree programs, ONLY proof of B2-level in English is required.

Note: Applicants with school education or university degree completed in the required languages need no proof of language skills (e.g., graduates of HTL, AHS, or bachelor's degree programs in Austria, etc.). In order to be able to check this, it is necessary that the transcript of records is attached to your school leaving certificate or university degree.

In exceptional cases, you have the possibility to submit the certificate(s) until [the application deadline](#) of the respective degree program.

Language skills can also be tested in an interview by the head of degree program or a person nominated by the head of degree program!

2. Application Process

The University of Applied Sciences Technikum Wien offers a fixed number of places for students each year. Information about the number of available places in each degree program is provided on the individual degree programs' web pages. Please note that the degree programs always start in the winter semester (September). In order to be accepted into a degree program at UAS Technikum Wien, prospective students must go through the admissions process.

Applying for a Bachelor's degree program

Prospective students who fulfill the formal admission requirements for a Bachelor's degree program can apply for acceptance into a degree program. Please use the [online application tool](#) on www.technikum-wien.at to apply. Once all data required have been provided and the formal admission requirements are fulfilled and documented, you will be invited to take an online placement test.

The placement test

The online placement test is a multiple choice test. You will work on and solve tasks from various fields of knowledge on the computer at high school graduation level:

- Algebra
- Functions
- Conclusions
- Text comprehension
- Physics and chemistry
- Electrical and Mechanical engineering
- Computer Science
- English

The last chapter of the online placement test

- Ready4Study

deals, with the expectations, motivation and personality of applicants.

On the basis of the results of the online placement test, the places available will be offered to the applicants with the best results. If one applicant cannot accept the offer the next one on the waiting list will take his or her place. Enrolment takes place online. After the confirmation of admission, further uploads in the online application tool are required. As soon as these have been completed by the applicant, the training contract is produced and must then be confirmed by the applicant. The status "student" is only awarded after the confirmation of the training contract. As soon as the applicant has enrolled and been awarded the official status "student", a certificate confirming this status can be issued if required for the residence permit.

Applying for a Master's degree program

After you have applied via the website, the admission requirements are checked.

The admission procedure consists of a subject-related online placement test and an interview.

3. Tuition

Fees for Bachelor's and Master's programs

Tuition fees for Bachelor's and Master's degree programs are currently € 363,36 plus € 25,20 for the Austrian National Union of Students (ÖH) per semester. The amount is invoiced until August 1st or January 15th with a payment term of 14 days.

Start of studies:

A definite confirmation of admission is linked to the payment of a deposit of € 250,- which must be paid within five working days (within seven calendar days) of the conditional offer of admission.

The deposit can be reclaimed up to the deadline of June 15th without giving reasons. If the deposit has been paid or reclaimed after June 15th, it will no longer be refunded.

Note: Any fees, expenses and exchange rate differences will be charged to the applicant and will reduce the refund amount by these.

The remaining amount (difference to the tuition fee € 113,36 plus ÖH currently € 25,20) will be invoiced until August 1st with a payment deadline of 14 days.

Please note: Tuition is tax deductible!

Costs for applicants/students from third countries

Deposit for applicants from third countries

For applicants from third countries, a deposit of € 250,00 is charged.

Applicants from third countries are those persons who are citizens of a third country and have fulfilled the relevant admission requirements for studying at the UAS Technikum Wien in a third country.

Third countries are all countries (except Switzerland) that do not belong to the European Union or the European Economic Area.

Tuition fees for third country students

Tuition fees in the amount of € 3,000 per semester are applied to students from third countries who have a residence permit according to § 64 of the Settlement and Residence Act ([Niederlassungs- und Aufenthaltsgesetz](#)). The following groups of persons are exempt from this regulation (cf. the [Ministry's Ordinance on Groups of Persons](#)):

1. Persons who

- either have had their main residence in Austria for at least five consecutive years immediately prior to the first application for admission to a study program at a higher education institution in Austria
- or who have at least one legal guardian with whom this is the case.

Proof: Current confirmation from the registration office about the regular main residence in Austria during the entire period (extract from the residential registry).

If the requirements are met by a person who is a legal guardian, the following additional proof is required:

- Marriage or birth certificate or
- proof of co-insurance with the person liable to pay maintenance or
- other proof that proves the obligation to support the applicant.

2. Persons who enjoy privileges and immunities in Austria on the basis of treaty or legal provisions, as well as persons who are abroad on behalf of the Republic of Austria at the time of acquisition of the matriculation certificate and enjoy privileges and immunities there on the basis of treaty or legal provisions, as well as their spouses and registered partners and their children.

Proof: diplomat card etc. in copy

3. Foreign journalists accredited in Austria and working here full-time as well as their spouses or registered partners and their children.

Proof: Copy of accreditation certificate and, if applicable, marriage certificate, birth certificate, certificate of registered partnership.

4. Persons who receive a scholarship for the intended studies either on the basis of state treaty provisions or in the same amount from the funds of an Austrian territorial authority which, according to the financial regulations of this territorial authority, are expressly to be used for scholarships.

Proof: Letter of award of the scholarship.

5. Holders of secondary school leaving certificates from Austrian schools abroad.

Proof: school leaving certificate

6. Persons who have obtained their highest school or university degree relevant to their application

- at an Austrian educational institution or
- within the European Union
- or within the European Economic Area

7. Persons who are entitled to stay in the federal territory on the basis of §§ 3, 8, 13 or 75 para. 5 and 6 of the Asylum Act 2005 (AsylG 2005), Federal Law Gazette I No. 100/2005, as amended by Federal Law Gazette I No. 145/2017, or according to earlier asylum law provisions.

Proof: asylum card or asylum document.

8. Persons who have a [residence permit](#) such as “Daueraufenthalt-EU“, „Familienangehöriger“, „Rot-Weiß-Rot-Karte“, „Rot-Weiß-Rot-Karte plus“, etc.

The respective proof documents are to be uploaded in the course of the online application in the online application tool.

Financial aid for students

There are many different types of financial aid for students: government aid, scholarships for independent students and other financial aid such as commuting allowances or traveling allowances as well as scholarships for language courses, performance-based scholarships and need-based scholarships. 4. Step-by-step to Vienna

4.1 Before Arrival

Visa arrangements

Please contact the Austrian Embassy in your country of residence for entrance regulations prior to your departure. You will have to apply for an entry visa to Austria at the nearest Austrian consulate before you travel to Austria. The issuance of a student visa may be a longer process, hence students should plan ahead as much as possible.

Tip: We recommend that you contact the Austrian representative authorities in your home country at the same time as you apply to UAS Technikum Wien to obtain information about entering or staying in Austria. If you need legalizations or translations, it is best to order these straight away and make an appointment with the relevant Austrian representative authority.

Renting an apartment

Before signing a rental agreement it is advisable to gather information about your rights and duties and to have the rental contract checked by an expert. An apartment search is time-consuming and should be well planned. If you assign an estate agency to the search of the suitable accommodation you have to pay commission (usually up to 3 months' rent) for this service. Take into account that deposits might have to be paid as well as payments for previous investments.

The OeAD student housing (<https://www.oeadstudenthousing.at/en/>) provides flats and rooms in halls of residence for international students (receivers of the OeAD grant, Erasmus students etc.). In general, the deposit is the amount of 2 monthly accommodation fees. After leaving the student residence the reservation deposit will be returned to you. On receipt of the completed application form, you will be informed about the address and location of your student residence.

- Public transport for a person under 26: € 300,- each year (starting from January 1st, 2026)

As a student at the UAS Technikum Wien you are insured for all the accidents that might happen at the UAS Technikum Wien but not beyond that. It is therefore very important that you also have insurance that covers events of illness or accident outside of the UAS Technikum Wien.

To Vienna City Center by train

The cheapest way to get from the airport to the city center is to use the S-Bahn S7 to the station “Wien Mitte-Landstraße Bahnhof”. The fare is around € 4,60 (one way, this also includes public transport in Vienna, e.g. subway or bus, if you have to change). Trains run every 30 minutes and the travelling time is around 25 minutes.

You can also use the CAT train (City Airport Train) to travel to Vienna from the airport (www.cityairporttrain.com). This train also takes you to the station “Wien Mitte-Landstraße Bahnhof”. The fare is about € 14,90 (one way, without a ticket for public transport in Vienna). Train Interval is 30 minutes; travelling time is 16 minutes.

Once you are in the city, buy a ticket for about € 3 (if you have not taken the S-Bahn) at the train station “Wien Mitte” (above the underground station “Wien Mitte-Landstraße Bahnhof” for the lines U3 and U4).

4.3 After Arrival

Registration

Within three days after your arrival in Vienna you have to register at the Registration Service Centre in one of the Vienna Municipal District Offices (“Magistratisches Bezirksamt”). You can register at any of the Registration Service Centres no matter which district you live in.

For registration, please bring:

- A valid passport
- The completed application form (residence registration) and your landlord’s signature if you live in a rented flat. This form is available at every Registration Service Centre in the Vienna District Offices or online at:

If you hold more than one citizenship you have to submit all documents proving your identity, place of birth, and nationality, i.e. travel documents

Registration certificate for EEA nationals and Swiss nationals

If you intend to stay in Austria for more than three (3) months, the Law on Residence and Settlement in Austria stipulates that you have to apply for a registration certificate at the Municipal Department 35 („Magistrat 35“). Please note that you have to do it in addition to registering at a Municipal District Office (see chapter above).

For the registration, please bring:

- A valid personal identity card or passport
- Proof of health insurance
- Confirmation of sufficient financial means (e.g. statement of bank account, confirmation of scholarship)
- Confirmation of registration at the Municipal District Office („Meldezettel“)

Please note that if you do not apply for a registration certificate in time, you commit an administrative offence punishable with a fine. Before you leave Vienna, it is compulsory to

de-register at the Municipal District Office. Take your passport and all copies of the registration form with you.

Working as a student in Austria

If you would like to work alongside your studies at the UAS Technikum Wien, please first check with the consulate to what extent your visa allows you to work in Austria (hours, etc.)

Public transport

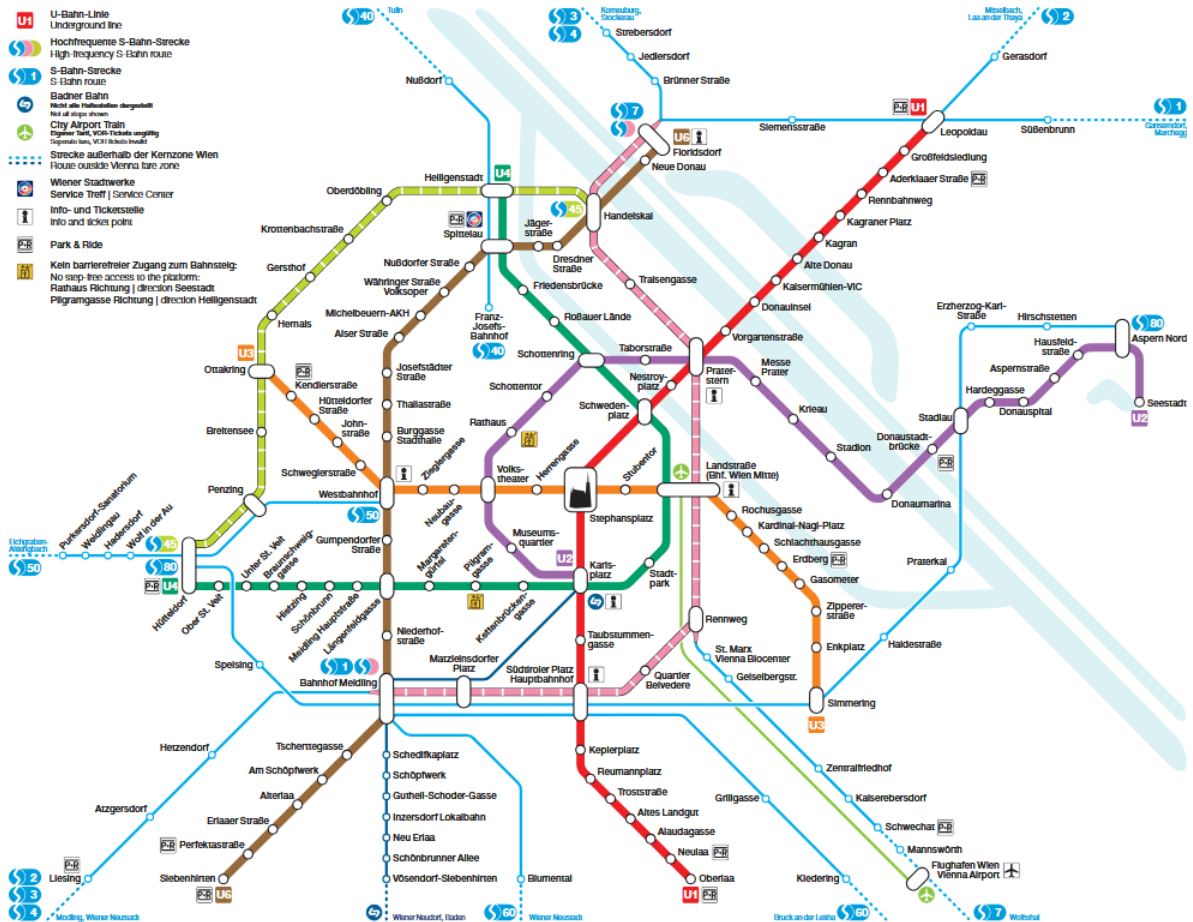
Vienna has a very good public transport system, which runs from about 5.00 am until around midnight. From Friday to Sunday and on public holidays the underground lines are running the whole night. Night buses are available during the whole week.

One ride into one direction (“1 Fahrt Wien online”) with the possibility to transfer costs about € 3,-. A monthly ticket (“31 Tage Wien digital”) costs about € 65,20 and is valid for the whole public transport system in the city of Vienna (“Kernzone Wien”). Tickets for public transport are available online, at the underground stations (vending machines), in some trams, at tobacconists and at the sales points of Wiener Linien.

Every person who is under 26 can buy an Annual Pass (“Jahreskarte”) for about € 300,- (purchase via [online ticketshop](#) or WienMobil App), which is valid for the whole year. You can also purchase your Annual Pass at all points of sale of Wiener Linien and at the customer service center at the metro station “Erdberg.

Trains

Safety

Vienna is a relatively safe city in the European Union, but following the basic precautions that would apply to living in any big city it is recommended to:

- Always have a copy of your passport with visa, and the original registration on you
- Watch out for pickpockets in crowded places
- Keep an eye on your luggage while traveling
- Store your valuables (money, credit cards) in a wallet in zipped pockets (on clothes or in a bag)
- Always know how you will get home late at night (the time of the last train/bus or the telephone number of a reputable taxi service)
- Do not react to verbal abuse/invitations
- Do not stay late at night in an isolated place with people you do not know

5. Studying at UAS Technikum Wien

ECTS – What is it?

The European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) is a measure of the scope of studies and indicates the maximum semester workload per course for students. Study units are allotted credits according to the amount of work they require. For each course students are accredited certain ECTS points. Information on courses and ECTS you can find at:

1 ECTS equals a workload of 25 hours à 60 minutes (≠ courses à 45 minutes!).

Assessment and grading system

The assessment of students' competence is based on the objectives and learning outcome presented in the curriculum. The performance requirements for study units may include examinations and various written and oral exercises. Study units are graded on a scale of:

Excellent (1)

Good (2)

Satisfactory (3)

Work meets minimal criteria (4)

Failed (5)

Blended Learning

UAS Technikum Wien offers extensive use of modern didactic methods such as Blended Learning. Blended Learning is the optimal combination of on-site teaching and online-supported self-study phases.

Students have the opportunity to...

- ...organize their learning activities with a high degree of flexibility in terms of time and space
- ...learn guided by virtual learning paths and to voluntarily self-check their own learning progress
- ...study in an application- and solution-oriented manner

CIS – Campus Information System

After confirmation of the training contract, you will receive access to our Campus Information System (CIS). CIS offers you the possibility to see your personal schedule, grades, as well as to create your personal profile with a picture and other personal details. You also have to use it for some of your classes in case the lecturers put the assignments and other important information online.

The login details for CIS, you will receive via email. On the account information sheet, you will find:

- Your email account and password
- Your email address: You are expected to check this email address regularly (as all information regarding your studies will be sent to this account).

TLC – Teaching and Learning Center

The TLC offers a wide range of services for students throughout their studies, both at the on-site and online (via virtual consultation hours or by e-mail).

From preparatory courses to Welcome Days to learning counselling: The TLC supports students and teachers throughout the semester, as well as prospective students even before they actually begin their studies.

Support for prospective students:

- **Refresher Courses:** Preparatory courses are offered for first-year students at UAS Technikum Wien who want an extra boost in mathematics, physics, computer science, electrical engineering, English or German (Bachelor studies) and electrical engineering, business administration or MATLAB (Master studies) before they start their studies. A deposit of € 50 is required for each refresher course. After attending at least 75% of the units of a course, the corresponding deposit will be refunded to the deposit account at the beginning of September.

Support during the studies:

- **Learning counselling:** As part of the learning counselling, students can arrange online counselling appointments where they have the opportunity to reflect on their learning habits together with a member of the Teaching and Learning Center and to receive useful tips. The learning counselling counsellor is there to provide you with the learning support you need. For issues that affect mental and social well-being, psychosocial counselling is also available.
- **Academic writing:** In addition to tips for overcoming large and small hurdles in the writing process, the academic writing offers appointments where students are actively supported in their writing projects. A Moodle course with helpful tips, links, overviews and tools is provided for this purpose. Various appointments (workshops, ask-me-anything rounds, cooperative writing appointments) are also organized through this platform.
- **Short tracks:** If several students fail the first attempt, the TLC organizes a free Short Track in which students can prepare as a group for the resit. The Short Track takes place in three compact teaching unit blocks (3LV = 2 hours 15 minutes) on specific topics.
- **Welcome Days:** At the University of Applied Sciences Technikum Wien, students are not simply thrown in at the deep end. Even before the students begin their studies, they are officially welcomed to the university during the Welcome Days. The first day follows a set program that provides the students with a general overview of the university.
